Context

#AllOfUS was successful on the national and local level.

... but ...

COVID-19 continues to move across the country in the midst of a divisive election and cratering economy.

Context

We have a lot of opportunity to grow proimmigrant *sentiment*.

Increasing immigration flow is a hard sell.

In other words ...

People will feel better about those who are already here but are hesitant across the board about people coming. (More true of conservatives but still true of liberals.)





The Survey

- A Random Control Trial (RCT) was conducted online among N=1,403 adults in North Carolina and N=1,041 adults in Wisconsin.
- Fielding occurred June 17-23, 2020
